On Becoming an Evangelist

So that's the parody...right? Somebody brings up evangelism, and we imagine being called on to go door to door, passing out flyers and delivering a short, well-rehearsed speech.

Maybe that approach worked at some time in the Church's life, but I don't know when that might have been. The door-to-door canvass treats faith like a commodity to be sold or like a rational proposition that one can be argued into accepting. Neither of those assumptions are true. One thing this idea of evangelism did accomplish, however...and that was to keep membership on evangelism committees really small. (Probably only the stewardship committee is tougher to recruit for.)

So you may be glad to hear that becoming an evangelist no longer requires sales training and good walking shoes. What it demands instead is gratitude.

Yep. Gratitude. An evangelist...someone who has good news that he/she is willing and able to share...can accomplish that sharing most effectively by simply being thankful to God. Thankful for the daily gift of life. Thankful for the beauty and abundance of the natural world. Thankful for family and friends and communities of nurture. Thankful for purpose and good work. Thankful for God's daily forgiveness that makes it possible to hit the floor each morning with a clean slate. Thankful for divine and unrelenting love. Thankful for the freedom and comfort of knowing that God's got this whole world and that God's got us. I'm sure you can add to the list.

So it is that evangelism is a way of life, not a sales pitch. When gratitude to God is the foundation for life, we can't help but embody a joy that makes itself apparent to the world around us. Over time, that joy will raise questions among those with whom we work and play...questions like why we are grateful, why we can hope even when times are tough, why we have been endowed with a sense of purpose. Gratitude also compels us to take an interest in our neighbors' lives...to see them as God sees them, to love them as God loves them, and to encounter them with genuine care. By gratitude, we become better neighbors to our neighbors.

Sometimes it feels as though gratitude is in short supply in this day and age.

We seem better at snark and sarcasm and selfishness, sometimes (we tell ourselves) for the sake of self-preservation. It doesn't have to be that way.

So here's an experiment: for the next month, try starting each day with a simple "Thank you, Jesus." Take note as to how your gratitude for life overflows into the lives of others. I'm willing to bet that before you know it, you'll be an evangelist of the first-order, sharing the goodness of God as a natural extension of the goodness you know you have received. And your corner of the cosmos is a better place, and God's kingdom grows. †

In 2011, guest artist Nicholas Pavkovic won the San Francisco Conservatory's Highsmith Award for orchestral composition. He also serves as the director of the Ross McKee Foundation.

He joins Prism Percussion, the dynamic San Francisco-based percussion duo that regularly performs works by underrepresented composers and demonstrates repertoire for a wide pallet of sounds available to percussionists. The duo's presence on stage is "both musically and visually stunning," affirms Jessica Balik of San Francisco Classical Voice. Their passion for percussion chamber music and for collaborating with composers and other musicians led them to create this duo, which fosters the creation of new works. †



Jim Storry was instrumental (pun intended) in the success of our bell choir. He reorganized the existing bell choir program and many of us continue to play & enjoy this contribution to our worship experience.



He was a wonderful teacher! We participated in several years of workshops, group performances with other churches and really began the Lessons and Carols, Easter, and other holiday performances.

Jim encouraged us to try new techniques and if we made a mistake, just keep ringing! Rehearsal was always fun, and he always welcomed a new ringer and made them feel at home. One Sunday as we prepared to play, we did not see Jim. We took our places in front of the congregation and No Jim! Here he had run to the office to get something and ran into someone and was talking in the hallway and then remembered we were to ring! He came back into the sanctuary, gave us a funny look and we started to play... a few minutes late... but we pulled it off! We all got a laugh out of it for many years.

He was always good for a laugh and loved what he did. He had many years of teaching in Northeast Ohio Schools and has left a legacy that will be hard to compete with. Jim also worked tirelessly on our concert series alongside Barbara McGregor. Now in our 38th season, he handled all the background details needed to make this series such a success. Jim routinely played the organ on Sundays, and for funerals and weddings. He also sang with us. As a tenor, he participated with our choir when Holy Trinity won the WCLV Choral Concert in Cleveland.

Sara Hutchins, our Mezzo- Soprano section leader for many years, shared some wonderful thoughts about Jim.

“Jim was one of the first people I met at Trinity and was there through my tenure with the choir. I grew to enjoy our 'chats' (more like hour long talks) about liturgical music and how music can add to worship throughout the almost 14 years that we worked together. After Trinity, Jim would continue to engage me as a soloist at the various churches he would serve, and we sang together with the Cleveland Orchestra Chorus, which makes Jim one of my oldest music friends, and he is by far the kindest. There was rarely a word that was not kind or caring, and Jim had such a passion for music and organ, that it was easy to see how he had made so many friends in the music community. His wisdom and stories will be missed, along with the music that he brought to this world. “

Jim was a member of the American Guild of Organists (AGO), both the Cleveland and Akron Chapters and sang with The Cleveland Orchestra Chorus for 50 years. His time at Holy Trinity was way more involved than this short remembrance. His passion for music and education was tireless and we are all better to have known him. We were so fortunate for him to share part of his journey with us, and our prayers and thoughts continue to be with his wife Sidney and their family. † *Written by Lesli Eisenhart*




DLM by the Numbers

Mid-Year Financial Report

So that everyone can better understand Holy Trinity's finances, I am pleased to provide you with this overview of our income and spending for this first half of 2021.

First, a word of appreciation. Your giving to support our mission from January through June totaled \$194,081. That is 4.91% higher than we anticipated. Thank you! Total income was \$294,440. That number is \$22,762 lower than expected, but only because we have taken no income from our General Savings account.

Our expenses for the first six months are under budget by \$9,687. This yields a net YTD loss of \$13,075 against operating income again because no savings account money was taken as income. Our cashflow is positive.

Our six (6) month dividends on non-operating income have totaled \$88,724 with administrative fees totaling \$7,269. We are ahead of our 2021 Budget by \$68,380.

The beginning Dedicated Accounts balance on January 1, 2021, was \$ 389,998. Year to date, we have received donations to our Dedicated Accounts of \$12,347 as well as an Endowment distribution of \$309,546. We have spent \$152,785 from these account during the first six months for an ending balance at June 30 of \$559,106.

Both the TLC and the Budget Endowments continue to increase with market activity. The current balance of these two (2) funds (as of this article) is \$10,860,053.

The General Fund savings account had a beginning balance of \$79,528. In May, we deposited \$300,000 into this fund from the PNC checking account in order to obtain a better return on our funds. As stated above, this fund remains untouched in 2021 with a June 30 balance of \$384,875.

The combined Invested Balance of TLC/Budget/General Fund is \$11,244,928.42 (The documented original Gift Amount of the TLC and Budget Endowment was \$6,051,429.51.)

Our current average weekly worship attendance/viewership is 551.7 people, the great majority of whom join us only online and many of whom are new to Holy Trinity. Thank you to the many among this group who regularly contribute to the support of our mission. We want you to be an on-going part of the Gospel work we share and would welcome your comments and suggestions for making that possible.

For the past five year school years, Holy Trinity has had the privilege of supporting Robinson Community Learning Center (CLC). What started out as simply providing filled school boxes to students that first year has evolved into a true partnership where we get to walk alongside the staff, students and families in a variety of ways. Then two years ago, the Robinson CLC became one of two schools to open a new Family Resource Center (FRC), operated by the United Way of Summit County. Holy Trinity immediately offered assistance, and a new partnership was formed. What a true blessing these past five years have been for us ... new friends made and new opportunities to serve our neighbors!!

Holy Trinity is once again partnering with both Robinson CLC and the FRC for the 2021-2022 school year ... and what an exciting year it will be!! Both the students and staff are thrilled to be returning to the classroom for in-person learning. To support this effort, Holy Trinity is again providing all teachers, tutors and Special Education Instructors with a bin filled with requested supplies. *NOTE: United Way of Summit & Medina Counties is providing all Robinson CLC students with filled backpacks from their 'Stuff the Bus' campaign.*

In addition to the teacher supplies, we have developed a robust outreach plan to not only provide support to the school, but to the neighborhood as well. And YOU are invited to serve with us ... there are a multitude of opportunities throughout the school year to plug in!!

- Providing books for Awards Assemblies and for other special recognition throughout the school year

- Providing monthly meals through the FRC to Robinson families
- Providing 20 food boxes for needy families for over winter break
- Providing gift cards for Student of the Month recognition +


