

Words to Build On

Words of Scripture for Remembrance & Reflection

30 passages of scripture from the Old and New Testaments, and a question for reflection.

This resource is a collection of God's promises of love, hope, and encouragement as we seek to live out our faith both individually and in community. Passages are from the NRSV translation, and some verses have been edited for inclusivity. As the foundation for our lives as Christians, the words of scripture are meant to build upon. While only a few verses are shared at a time, we know that scripture does not stand alone—it is always a part of a larger context. When needed, feel free to expand on the context of passages or give them in a more complete setting. +

Slowing Down is Important

So there is still a Sabbath rest for God's people. God rested from his work. Those who enjoy God's rest also rest from their works. So let us make every effort to enjoy that rest. (Hebrews 4:9 NIRV)

You may remember that, last August, we joined other congregations across our synod in observing a month-long sabbath. After receiving Bishop Barbins' invitation to do so again this summer, our Church Council has designated the month of July as HTLC's congregational sabbath. Routine committee and ministry team business meetings will be suspended to allow time for our leaders to rest.

God's people need to remember that slowing down to rest is as important as work. As Donna Schaper says in her book, *Sabbath Keeping*:

"I am keenly aware of the need for sabbath keeping because everywhere I go people urge me to go faster, to do more. Keeping sabbath keeps me sane. I walk, pray, sing, garden, worship – and do so with a discipline and vigor that keeps play and praise in my life. God is good to me. Sabbath keeping is a spiritual strategy: it is a kind of judo. The world's commands are heavy; we respond with light moves. The world says work; we play. The world says go fast; we go slow. These light moves carry sabbath into our days, and God into our lives.

"Our culture urges us to think we need more of just about everything. In fact, we need less. Keeping sabbath is a conscious choice to restrict input. It is a decision not to work in all the available time, but rather intentionally to play in some of the time we have. Keeping sabbath is a method for focus, rest, and play in a life otherwise dominated and tyrannized by scattered-ness, fatigue, and work. Keeping sabbath allows us to say **yes** to a life that is grounded in God's grace, and then to receive more than we could ever have imagined of rest and play. For sabbath keeping allows us time to love, and thus restores to us the joy of our salvation."

Although morning devotions on Facebook Live will be suspended for the month of July, a special on-line daily devotional will be made available.

May our sabbath month provide those who so faithfully lead our congregation the refreshment they need as we prepare for a new season of ministry in Jesus' name! +

Praise the Almighty, who prospers your work and defends you; see from the heavens the showers of mercy God sends you. Ponder anew what the Almighty can do; Infinite Love here befriends you.



Joachim Neander

Praise the Almighty! In wonder my spirit is soaring! All that has life and breath, come now with praises outpouring. Let the amen sound from God's people again, gladly forever adoring.

As a student in Bremen, Germany, Joachim Neander lived a godless life. Though both his father and grandfather were Lutheran ministers, Joachim wasted his life in immorality. Then, when Neander was twenty, a preacher named Under-Eyke came to Bremen. Neander went to the meeting intending to ridicule the preacher, but instead he was converted.

Four years later he became headmaster of a school in Düsseldorf, and during his time there he wrote more than sixty hymns. Because of his strong Christian views and his evangelistic activities, he displeased the authorities and was eventually removed from his position.

Despite the tensions, he wrote many hymns of praise. He often wandered through the valleys and hills near Düsseldorf, communing with his Lord. After losing his position at the school, he lived for a time in a cave and continued to write hymns. He died very young, at the age of thirty, but he left behind him a legacy of praise to God. +

Ernie Liska Memorial Scholarships Awarded

Holy Trinity Lutheran Church is pleased to announce that graduating Seniors Tyshiea Johnson from Firestone Community Learning Center (CLC), Haura Sairi from Buchtel Community Learning Center (CLC), and Nicholas Kohut from Akron Early College are recipients of the 2023 Ernie Liska Memorial Scholarship. Each will receive \$1,000.

In memory of Ernest (Ernie) W. Liska and his devotion to God, country and service to others, Holy Trinity established The Ernie Liska Memorial Scholarship in 2019 to provide financial assistance to high school Seniors graduating from any Akron Public Schools who plan to earn a college degree or become certified in a vocational/building trade.

Tyshiea Johnson (photo included) graduated from Firestone CLC and plans to attend Kent State University to major in Nursing. Tyshiea was a member of National Honor Society and volunteered in numerous activities. Her teachers describe her as "... kind, dependable, and responsible, a natural born leader who is willing to lend a helping hand. She shows great attention to detail, has an eagerness for learning, and handles responsibility well." When asked what receiving the Ernie Liska Memorial Scholarship means to her, Tyshiea replied, "I'm very honored to receive this scholarship. It will certainly help me reach my goals of being a nurse."

Haura Sairi (photo included) graduated from Buchtel CLC and has been accepted at The University of Akron where she has been awarded a Presidential Scholarship. Currently, she is planning to obtain a dual major in Statistics and Computer Science. While in high school, Haura participated in DECA, which prepares emerging leaders and entrepreneurs in marketing, finance, hospitality, and management. Her activities included National Honor Society, the school yearbook, and serving as Secretary for her Senior class. In addition, she is a talented artist. Haura commented, "Receiving this scholarship means so much because it's enabling me to continue my education which will help me achieve my future endeavors."

In one of Haura's letters of recommendation, her English teacher stated, "Haura serves as a role model, volunteering as a math tutor and technology mentor for other students. She is organized, eager to learn, and determined to succeed."

Nicholas Kohut (photo included) graduated from Akron Early College High School and is planning to attend The University of Akron to major in Computer Science. Students at Akron Early College take college courses as part of their academic studies. Nicholas began taking one course each semester starting in his freshman year and continued to increase his course load, becoming a full-time college student his junior year. Nicholas was named Valedictorian of his class with a 4.49 weighted GPA. He graduated not only from Akron Early College, but also from The University of

Akron with an Associates of Arts degree with more than 60 hours of college credit.

Not only has Nicholas excelled academically, but his resume also includes many extracurricular activities, including National Honor Society, student leadership (mentoring), as well as participation in running, weight lifting, and tennis. Nicholas shared, "Going to college is such an incredible gift, one that I don't take for granted. This scholarship is allowing me to continue on my journey, and I am so grateful."

Ernie Liska was drafted during the Vietnam War, starting his Army career at Fort Bragg, North Carolina. While in Vietnam, he was





assigned to an artillery unit and then sent to Germany, serving at a Nike missile base. Achieving the rank of Lieutenant Colonel, he later continued his military reserves. Ernie was employed at the Pentagon where he worked in the Office of the Secretary of Defense. Throughout a career spanning 26 years, Ernie was respected for his knowledge and ability to relate to others.

"Ernie was a kind and giving man who touched and impacted the lives of so many," commented his wife, Elizabeth Liska, and a member of the Scholarship Committee. "Whether taking people to the doctor, grocery store or church to visiting people in nursing homes and feeding the homeless, he was always giving. Because serving others was such a large part of his life, including a volunteer and service component to the scholarship was very important."


