
Holy Week

Have a Beautiful. Terrible Lent!

Lenten Mid-Week Devotions & Lunch

Join us each Wednesday through March 27 for midweek Lenten devotions and a meal together in Room 202. This year we will be meditating and discussing selections from *Have a Beautiful*, *Terrible Lent!* by Kate Bowler.

Lent marks the forty days leading up to Jesus' execution and surprising return to life three days later. It is a practice that began during the fourth century as a way to prepare Christians for the holiest, hardest days of our story.

During Lent, we ask God to show us the world as it is. We begin on Ash Wednesday with the reality of our finitude rubbed on our foreheads – from dust we were made, to dust we shall return. Then, we walk through that reality in a kind of dress rehearsal. It is the downward slope of God – the Great Descent. The whole church must descend to the depths with their savior. Frankly, Lent is my favorite part of the church calendar. Suddenly, all of us are on the losing team. And we look at each other with well-earned wonder, horror, and awe. We begin to tell each other the truth again: life is so beautiful and life is so hard. For everyone.

Of course, the cross isn't the end of the story. But this season of grief is carved out to acknowledge the reality of Jesus' sacrifice. Our savior knew pain and grief and despair, and so do we. Easter is coming, yes. But for now, we sit in the ashes of our broken dreams and broken hearts, knowing that God sits here with us.

The Daily Examen


The Daily Examen is an ancient way to reflect on your day. To practice it, answer four questions (below). When practicing the Examen in your family or in a group, you can go through the questions one at a time, or you can have each person answer all four questions before moving on to the next person.

- 1. Was there something memorable that happened to you today?

 Remember one moment from today by taking a picture of it in your mind. Describe the picture with as much detail as possible.
- 2. Was there a time when you felt close to God today? Something of beauty, someone being or showing kindness, or you being at peace. Describe this moment and how you felt.
- 3. Was there a time when you felt far from God today? Feeling sad, lonely, anxious, or unsettled or perhaps you witnessed someone being unkind to another. Describe this moment and how you felt.
- 4. What from today are you grateful for? Think of reasons to be grateful, from the deep and profound to the ordinary things you might take for granted.

End the exercise with a few moments of silents and by saying 'Amen.' †

- COMMEND God, into your hands I commend my spirit. Luke 23: 46
- **BELIEVE** focus on Luke 24: 10-11



The Role of Music in the Church

"Except for theology, there is no art that can be placed in comparison with music." - Martin Luther

Luther also goes on to say that music makes people kinder, gentler, calmer and more reasonable. Music is the only art capable of affording peace and joy of heart...the devil flees before the sound of music almost as much as before the Word of God.

So, what is the role of music in the church and how is that music chosen?

Music is part of our history. All peoples throughout recorded history have worshiped their gods with music. The Israelites sang after the deliverance from Egypt, David sang in times of celebration and trouble; Mary and Simeon sang songs of thanksgiving. There is an entire book in the bible dedicated to music...The Book of Psalms. (Psalm by the way means sacred song.) As Lutherans our primary instrument is the human voice a gift given by God to proclaim the Word of God. Music and visual arts and the environment of our worship spaces embody the proclamation of the Word. Music is a servant to the Gospel. Our liturgy is a mostly sung liturgy for this reason. We use a variety of liturgy settings and hymns to enhance the theme of the day and season of the church year.

I believe the Holy Spirit works through music. Is there a connection with people who have Alzheimer's or Parkinson's that cannot communicate effectively with speech but can sit down at a piano or other instrument and play or sing unaffected by their illness? Have you noticed in nursing homes or when visiting a shut in how hymns touch people deeply who otherwise have been relatively uncommunicative? Certain hymns have etched themselves onto our hearts and when we hear the tune the words of praise erupt from the soul.

I encourage you to look through ELW- our hymnal at the various liturgies and hymns. Think on how that particular liturgy

or hymn affects you. Almost all of them are on YouTube. You might find one you like that we haven't done here at HTLC. By the way, if you have a favorite hymn we have sung or that is not in our hymnal feel free to contact any member of the music & worship team. or email John Catlos at jcatlos@holytrinityakron.org.

Now, how is this music chosen?

- 1. What is the theme of the day? We look at the lessons.
- 2. What are the liturgical actions taking place on the day? Is there a baptism, communion, an installation, a dedication, a farewell?
- 3. What is the function of each hymn? Is it a gathering hymn or sending hymn? Hymn of the Day or Communion Hymn?

The Worship & Music Team spends a great deal of time on hymn selections.

Hymn selection begins with the reading of scripture for each service, often done at home before meetings. Then at the meeting Pastor Becki talks us through where she thinks she is headed with the theme of each service. Occasionally a suggestion is made that sends her in a different direction. Is that the Holy Spirit working through music? We use a couple of difference resources to guide us. A manual by Lutheran publisher, Augsburg Fortress called *Sundays and Seasons* which lays out any given worship service with thoughts, and suggestions. Our synod puts out a list of hymn suggestions for each service, and we look at a list of congregational favorites to see how any of these might fit as well.

We take each hymn one at a time a debate the possibilities and come to a consensus. Other times, especially for festival Sundays, I will be sitting down with our new Interim Organist and we will look at all the things mentioned above, plus look at our resources for hymns that have festive instrumental parts or accompaniments. We will then inform the music & worship team of choices that have been made and receive feedback from the team.

Again, I ask you to look at our hymnal especially at hymns you do not know and look them up YouTube. You might just find a new favorite. †

It's been nearly a year in the making! Join us for the Invite Welcome Connect Kick-Off Event on April 28!

What is Invite Welcome Connect and how did it come to be at Holy Trinity? This is a great, two-part question! Guided by the gospel directive to "Go and make disciples of all nations," the ministry of Invite Welcome Connect equips and empowers individuals and congregations to practice evangelism (invite), hospitality (welcome), and connectedness (connect).

The Invite Welcome Connect concept was introduced to Holy Trinity in the spring 2022. To learn more about this ministry program and what it could do for this congregation, the Renaissance Committee hosted a full-day training in November 2022 with Invite Welcome Connect founder Mary Parmer. More than 20 Holy Trinity members attended along with several others from area congregations. Borne out of this session was the need for Holy Trinity to embrace the Invite Welcome Connect Ministry and incorporate it in all aspects of church life. With Council approval to launch this new ministry, it was determined that an Invite

Welcome Connect Ministry Team was needed. At the April 2023 Special Congregational Meeting, members voted to approve an amendment to the Bylaws of changing the Welcome Ministry Team to the Invite Welcome Connect Ministry Team.

For the past year, the Invite Welcome Connect Ministry Team has been working hard! We completed high-level self-assessments in each of the areas of Invite, Welcome and Connect. We discussed at length and in great detail the goals we wanted to set for 2024 and identified the tactics needed to achieve these goals.

And now, it's time to share this information with all of you!

In order for Invite Welcome and Connect to be effective, it needs to be ... it must be ... incorporated into all aspects of church life.

This includes worship, fellowship, outreach and service. In order for Invite Welcome Connect to be a success, it needs you - **ALL OF US** - working together as we invite, welcome and connect people to Jesus through love and the word of God.


