A Call to Reflect

“Better one handful with tranquility than two handfuls with toil and chasing after the wind.” (Ecclesiastes 4:6)

There is something about autumn that draws me inward. As the leaves begin to change color, the days get shorter, leaves begin to fall, and colder air moves in, I tend to become introspective. Perhaps it has something to do with bittersweet reality that although fall leaves are brilliant with color, they are in fact dying, and that every October marks another year of life for me.

And so I think deeply about my life at this time of year, pondering questions like:

- Where have the years carried me?
- How have I grown?
- What have I learned?
- How has my past contributed to my present?
- Where do I find joy?
- What is my passion?
- What do I still want to accomplish?
- What challenges do I face?
- What are my limitations?
- What do I need to let go of?
- How do I best fulfill God’s call at this point in my life?

This annual inner call to reflect is one the reasons I appreciate autumn. Too often we don’t stop long enough to take a deep breath, let alone think about where we’ve been, where we are now, and where we’re headed.

What is true of us as individuals is also true of us as congregations. We get so busy doing the week-in-week-out work of the church that we don’t set aside the time needed to wrestle with the deeper questions that need wrestled with from time to time. It seems easier to keep on doing the things we’ve been doing, regardless of what has changed. The questions that I ask of myself every year at this time are the same kind of questions that congregations need to ask of themselves as well.

That is one of the reasons our denominational leadership promotes intentional interim periods between called pastors. Congregational leaders need focused time to intentionally sort through what has been and what is now, to prepare for the call process. The most successful pastoral calls come about when time and energy are fully invested in the interim period.

To that end, I have recommended that we consider engaging a consultant with experience working with churches doing the challenging work of inner city ministry in today’s culture. I have received a few recommendations and have been encouraged by preliminary conversations I have had with those individuals. I will be taking information back to our Congregational Council in November.

In the meantime, keep doing what you are doing by way of offering your support and prayers for Holy Trinity’s ministry. We still have a mission to “Bring Jesus to people through love and the word of God.” We just need a concrete plan as to how we are going to go about it in the next 3 to 5 years! †

P.S. Speaking of the importance of self-reflection, including acknowledging changes and limitations...



Organ Update

Leek Pipe Organ Company staff members have been hard at work as the refurbishment of the organ's wind system progresses. A number of crawl boards and protective panels were constructed to cover complex cabling & other electrical components (i.e. solid state panels) that will stay in place during the removal of the bellows. We are grateful for their care and attention to detail. †




Alphabet of Gratitude





A Double Baptism




Several organizations participated in the DLM Partners Fair on October 9 where Holy Trinity members learned more about how they work together with DLM to support the children and families of this community.
