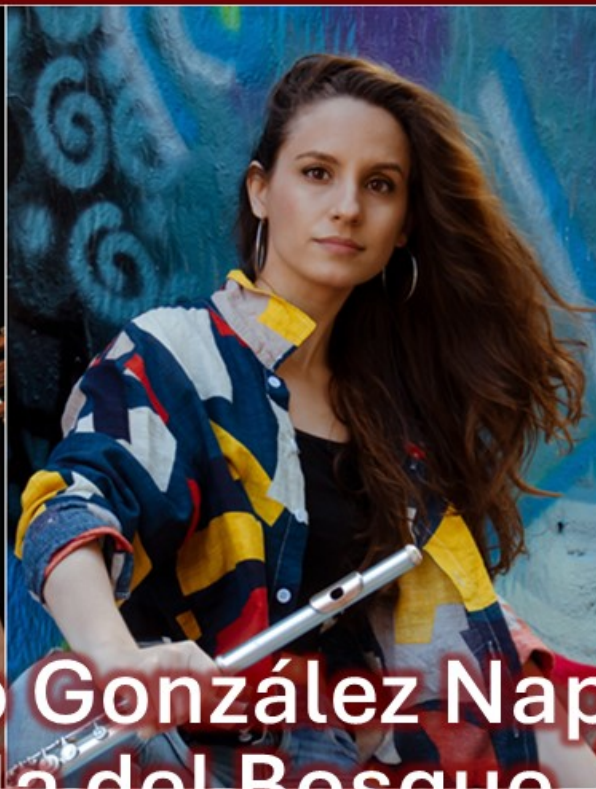

God Keeps His Promises!

As we gathered for our monthly Hike & Seek in April at Brandywine Falls, we focused our attention on Psalm 42: 1-6 for our devotions before our hike.

¹ As the deer longs for streams of water,
so I long for you, O God.
² I thirst for God, the living God.
When can I go and stand before him?
³ Day and night I have only tears for food,
while my enemies continually taunt me, saying,
“Where is this God of yours?”
⁴ My heart is breaking
as I remember how it used to be:

I walked among the crowds of worshipers,
leading a great procession to the house of God,
singing for joy and giving thanks
amid the sound of a great celebration!
⁵ Why am I discouraged?
Why is my heart so sad?
I will put my hope in God!
I will praise him again—
my Savior and ⁶ my God!

The Psalmist laments how things used to be. He is outside the city of Jerusalem, feeling very alone and remembering the large gatherings of worship that used to take place in the temple. He is grieving and yet in his grief he remembers God’s promises – “I will put my hope in God! I will praise him again – my Savior and my God!”

Our Hike & Seek group discussed how we, too, are remembering how things used to be. Several of us have lost loved ones over the past year and are trying to figure out how to live life without their physical presence. Some of us have children leaving home. Some of us are dealing with old and new health issues. And all of us remember when there were large gatherings of worship in the sanctuary of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church. We remember when the halls were filled, and we are sad that things are changing. Some of us feel alone. We could relate to the lament and the broken heart of the psalmist.

And yet in the midst of grief there is good news! Good news that we can put our hope in God! In this Easter season we are reminded that God has fulfilled the covenant promise of hope to us in the person of Jesus! Jesus – Emmanuel, “God with us” – we are not alone. God is present! God works and moves even when things aren’t how they used to be. It’s ok to grieve. Grief points us to hope, and our hope, as Christians, is in Jesus!

As we walked along the water that morning, all of a sudden, a rainbow appeared by the waterfall! We all stood amazed, giddy, and snapping pictures! In a moment of pause, someone said, “See, God keeps his promises!”

May we all join the psalmist, even in our grieving, and say, “I will put my hope in God! I will praise him again – my Savior and my God!” †

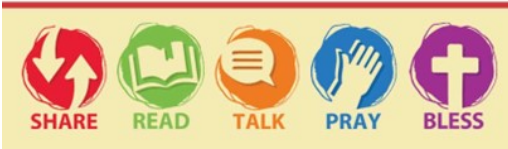

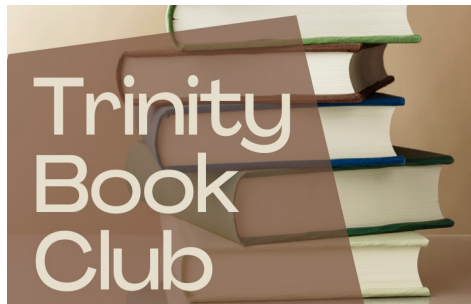
Faith5 Fridays @ 9 a.m. via Zoom

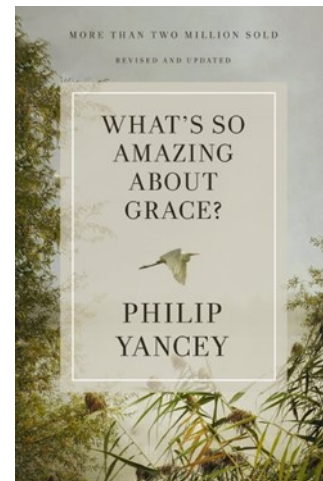

These three words are a vision of something new that has taken root here at Holy Trinity ... a culture shift that moves us from maintenance to mission.

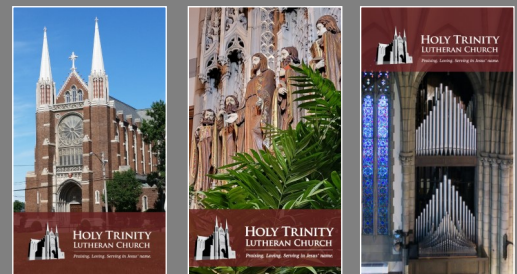
Invite Welcome Connect is a ministry of transformation that equips and empowers individuals and congregations to cultivate intentional practices of evangelism, hospitality, and belonging.

We Remember During Holy Week

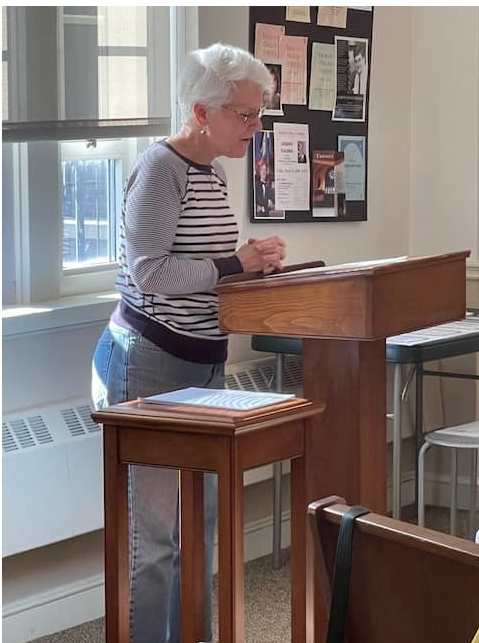

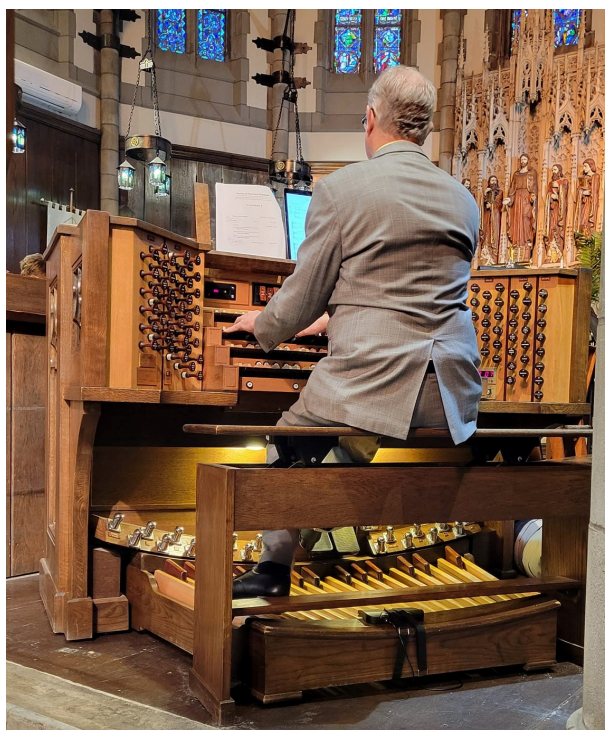
